



INDIAN PALMS HOA

July 2023

TURF

Mowing – Mowing height will remain the same for the rest of the season.

Fertilization – There are no fertilization applications scheduled for this month.

Herbicide – Nutsedge will be treated with Sedgehammer.

*Turf areas may begin to thin in shady areas as ryegrass dies in the heat. Bermuda does not grow in the shade. There may be shady areas with no grass. Continue to spray nutsedge with herbicide if present.



SHRUBS

Focus Pruning – Heavy pruning will be avoided to prevent any sun damage.

Plant Replacement – Plant replacements will be completed per work order.

*Shrub pruning should be limited to prevent burning foliage.



TREES

Scheduled Trimming – Washingtonian palms are scheduled for trimming throughout the months of June and July as flowers mature.

*Washingtonian palms will continue to be pruned throughout July.



HIGHLIGHTS

Notes: July is the hottest month of the year with temperatures often exceeding 110 degrees. These high temperatures are difficult for both plants and landscape workers.

Adequate irrigation is critical to prevent plant damage during high heat. Water use will probably exceed allocated amounts in order to keep plants healthy. Irrigation must be monitored daily for coverage and amount.

Annual flowers will be struggling in the heat and must be watched closely for pests and disease.
