

## INDIAN PALMS HOA JUNE 2024

TURF



Mowing – Mowing will continue to be completed at a normal height.

\*Turf areas will be in full transition. Hot spots will appear as rye grass dies off and Bermuda fills in. Increase irrigation as the weather heats up. Treat nut sedge and broadleaf weeds as they appear.

Fertilization – No fertilization is scheduled this month.

**Herbicide** – Ryegrass will continue to die out because of the warmer weather. Dead spots are expected to ride while Bermuda takes hold. Herbicide will be sprayed to control nutsedge and other weeds as needed.

## SHRUBS

Focus Pruning – Shrubs will be pruned to control their rapid growth.

\*Limit pruning on shrubs, especially on those varieties susceptible to sunburn damage. Limit new plantings until fall.

## TREES

**Scheduled Trimming** – Washingtonian Palms are scheduled for pruning this month.

\*Washingtonia robusta palms will be pruned this month and July.

## HIGHLIGHTS

**Notes:** June begins the season of consistent temperatures over 100 degrees. Landscape plants will be under stress as will landscape workers. Take precautions to limit heat stress related problems.
